It is a show day for her. Bluebird will not be competing in this show, Emily will be riding Missy's horse Socks. She is also taking Arion and Four. New friend Frankie will be attending the show and Emily has a surprise for her...Emily gets invited to attend the Talent Scout training weekend and she is taking Socks. The riders will be competing for a scholarship to train in Europe the following year and some of the riders might get chosen for the Junior Olympic team. Emily decides she is going to have fun at the clinic and once she makes that decision, it is like she "became a different person and Socks became a different horse" ...There are five competitors and their horses at the clinic: Emily has Socks, Jess is there with Valor, Andy has Mousse, Bridget has Panda and Valerie has Adagio. On the last day, they will all compete in a show and the winner will be chosen...Will Emily confront Jess with her suspicions? What will happen if she does? Has Jess really changed?
