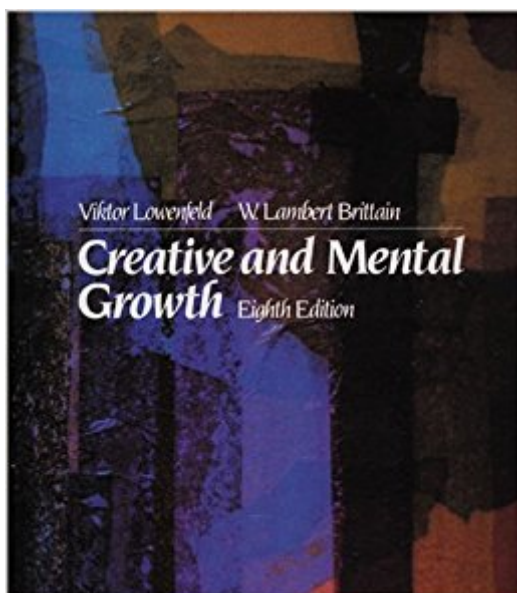


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# Creative And Mental Growth (8th Edition)
