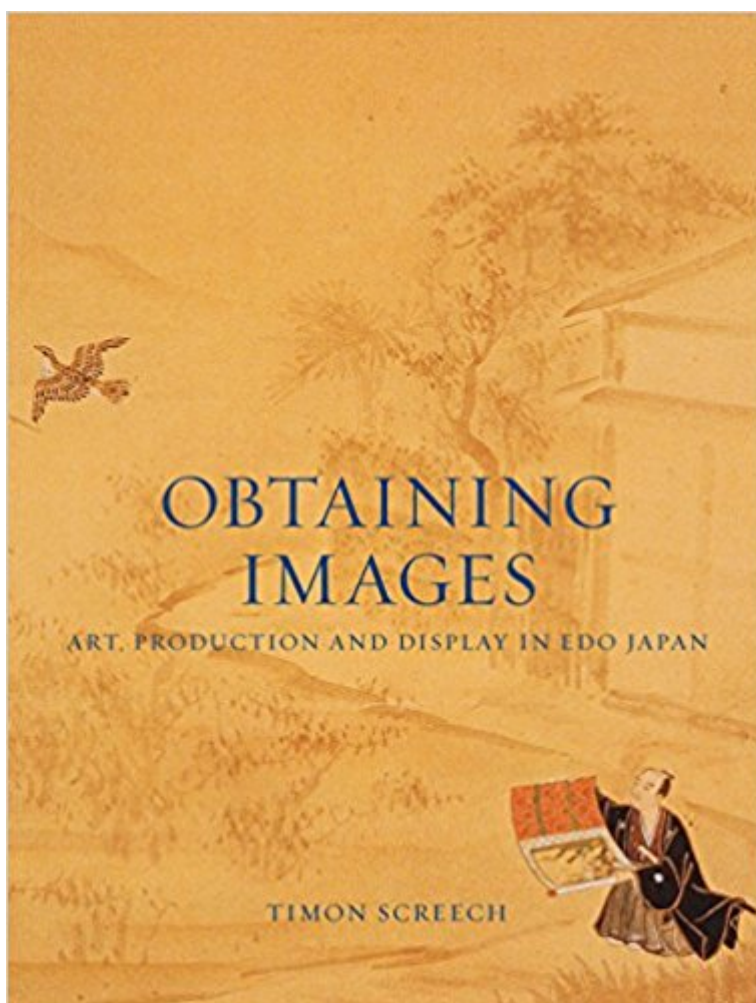

Screech explores the complex network of different imperatives and motivations that negotiated different traditions and how these forces resulted in the variety of styles we've come to associate with the period. Good framework. But Chapter 2 is full of ungrounded guesses and blatant mistakes. E.g. Fukurokuju means "good fortune, official income, and longevity" but on p. 33 it is said to be "the name of the god of long-life". Also, p. 48 talks about the eagle on the painting while in fact what is depicted is a turtle!
