

We are huge Tomie dePaola fans here and the 26 Fairmount Avenue series is partially why. My five year old daughter and I read the whole series together and our only complaint is that it doesn't continue. Excellent writing, fabulous illustrations, and you really feel like you get to know little Tomie. Love it!

I bought this book for my 7 year old son who is finishing first grade and is just starting to read chapter books (by chapter books, I mean longer ones, not just the "Henry and Mudge" types that can be read in 20 minutes). I love this book! It is like hearing a funny grandpa tell you about his childhood. Mr. de Paola is a good narrator of his own life. My son really got a kick out of some of the antics, like how Tomie behaved while seeing Snow White in the movie theatre. I read the first chapter out loud to my son to make sure he comprehended it. It did, and then he finished the rest of the book himself. I highly recommend this book to any first or second grader. Teachers and parents would enjoy reading it as well.

Tomie dePaola has a very good writing style, and the artwork is fun, too. I recommend the book for anyone who enjoys childrens' books - especially those books about life in 1938. It would be a superb grandparent-to-grandchild book.

This is a lovely story, well written, nicely paced for a 4-6 year olds, and with humor throughout. We read the entire series to our son, and I buy it for nieces and nephews when they are 4 or 5.
