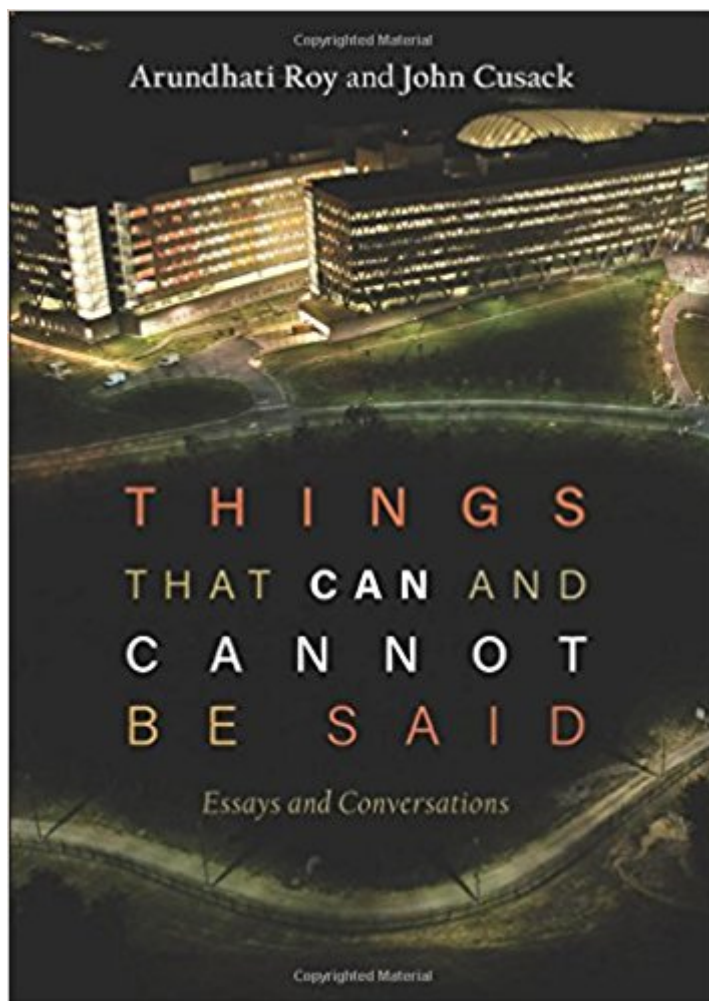

In late 2014, Arundhati Roy, John Cusack, and Daniel Ellsberg travelled to Moscow to meet with NSA whistleblower Edward Snowden. The result was a series of essays and dialogues in which Roy and Cusack reflect on their conversations with Snowden. Even in the short snippets of their conversation in the book, you felt the raw emotion coming from Ellsberg at being with a kindred spirit. Roy, as always, packs a punch in an almost lyrical way. Cusack asks the right questions, follows with his own thoughts and it never felt contrived or staged. I found myself doing more research and reading more books to be more informed. What I took most from this book was that we cannot sit idly by and wait for politicians and those in charge to do what we want. We have to act and not blindly have faith in a

transparency that will never exist. When I finished the book, I reread it and picked out the quotes, statements and or facts that I wanted to learn more about. As much as a follow-up book would be appreciated, I was given enough from this book to continue becoming better informed on my own. In fact, since reading this I've read Robert S. McNamara's book and just started a Noam Chomsky book.
