

Overall, I perceive the value of the content in this text as 4.5 out of 5.0. This book provokes a lot of deep thinking, so please do not expect this to be a fast or easy read. I was recommended to review this text by my pastor and I found this book quite insightful. It can serve as an initial guide for areas of additional research. In addition, at least I now feel that I have a general, elementary, understanding of the significant worldviews and how they relate or contrast with each other from the perspective of Christianity as perceived by the author.
